### May 12th Speaker and Program (Virtual Program at 7:30PM)


Our May speaker is Dr. Uttara Samarakoon. She is an Assistant Professor and Coordinator for Greenhouse and Nursery Management Program, at Ohio State University Agriculture Technical Institute (ATI).

Dr. Samarakoon provides leadership as the Coordinator of the Associate of Applied Science Degree in the Greenhouse and Nursery Management program that includes Greenhouse Management, and Greenhouse Engineering Technology specializations. Dr. Samarakoon teaches tgreenhouse production courses of annuals and vegetables, plant propagation, and greenhouse environment control.

Dr. Samarakoon's research program focuses on developing sustainable crop production technology for ornamental and hydroponic vegetable crops in controlled environment agriculture.

Dr. Samarakoon received her Ph.D. degree in Plant Science from the Institute of Agriculture and Environment from the Massey University in New Zealand and her Master's degree in Crop Science from the University of Peradeniya, Sri Lanka.

For her presentation, Dr. Samarakoon will define hydroponics, where and how hydroponic crops are produced, and if you have hydroponic produce as part of your diet. She will summarize the contributions and opportunities of hydroponic food crop production in the U.S. Also, hydroponic food production systems at Ohio State ATI will be discussed regarding teaching and research. ### A Pollinator Garden Opportunity

The Orange Branch of the Cuyahoga County Library has a pollinator garden installed by volunteers in 2018. The garden is about 1800 sq. ft. and holds at least 25 native plant species. Among others you can find ironweed, cone flowers and bee balm (Monarda). Unfortunately, you can also find weeds.

So, here is an opportunity for members of the Gardeners of Greater Cleveland - Help out with some gardening basics like weeding and the volunteers will pass their pollinator gardening knowledge on to you. This is an ideal opportunity for master gardeners to earn community service credit.

Two members of the GOGC who are already involved are Julie Shaw and Tom Davis. They will be working in the garden regularly on Monday mornings from 9 - 10 AM (weather permitting). There will be other crews there on Wednesdays and Thursdays.
