September! The Fall equinox will occur Saturday, September 23, at 2:49 AM. Our day and night lengths will be 12 hours long as the daylengths continue to shorten. This changing photoperiod, along with cooler night temperatures, will promote the process of chlorophyll degradation within leaf chloroplasts, exposing the colorful masked pigments that produce our colorful tree and shrub leaf displays each fall. Continue to plant new trees and shrubs such that their root systems are established before the ground freezes. Bulbs may start to be planted now for colorful early spring gardens next year, and cool-season veggies may be continued to be planted early this month to get in a quick crop before cold weather sets in later this fall. Colorful garden mums, which appeared in garden centers last month, also may be added to your gardens. Of course, most annuals will continue to add beauty to your gardens along with late-flowering perennials and shrubs. One of my favorite fall-flowering perennials are colchicums or autumn crocus. Colchicums send up foliage from their bulbs in the sp<mark>ring which dies off during the early summer. Then their large</mark> crocus-type flowers appear "magically" this time of year. Be sure to stop fertilizing your perennials this month so that they may go dormant in a timely fashion before the onset of winter.

I did serve as one of four Apprentice Judges at the Akron Horticulture Show on August 21. We judged exhibits with four Certified Horticulture Judges: GoGC member Tom Davis, and Tom Ahrens, John Schinker, and Rodney Toth from Youngstown. Not only was it fun to actually judge exhibits for the first time, it also was a valuable learning experience as I learned a lot from the two judges on the judging team to which I was assigned. I thank Jim Bell who taught the four judging school classes I attended as I felt well prepared to start judging shows as an Apprentice Judge.

As we are "dirt gardeners" please volunteer time to help at the Willott Iris Garden and at our club's "Adopt-a-Bed" at the Lantern Court Estate at Red Oak Camp. Our committees would welcome new members, too, to assist in the numerous activities put on by the club! Thank you for your active participation!
