URBAN FARM EXPANDS WITH HELP OF GOGC GRANT BY CAROL POH

February's guest speaker, Steve Roberts, updated our club on the recent expansion of the Trinity Cathedral Charlie Comella Urban Farm at East 35th and Cedar—work enabled by a grant of \$963 from the Gardeners of Greater Cleveland. Begun in 2005, the farm was initiated and is sustained by volunteers (many but not all affiliated with the cathedral) who labor there each Saturday to grow fresh vegetables for the tables of hungry city residents. Steve, a lifelong vegetable grower and the grandson of a Marion County agricultural extension agent, installed the farm's irrigation system 12 years ago and continues to maintain it by repairing winter damage and performing weekly upkeep.

Steve explained that the grant allowed farm volunteers to add three new beds this past May, each 16 feet long and 4 feet wide. (An earlier grant from the Gardeners of America, of which our club is an affiliate, funded the extension of a water line equipped with a faucet to enable irrigation of six new raised garden beds.) In all, the new beds this season yielded 652 lbs. of tomatoes, 22 lbs. of yellow squash, and 6 lbs. of peppers. All of the farm's produce is delivered to the food bank of the Friendly Inn Settlement in Cleveland's Central neighborhood.

No urban farm is without its tribulations. Steve recounted an errant motorcycle rider cutting across the farm's garden beds. (The damage to the beds could be repaired, not so the motorcycle.) Then there was a battle with lantern flies. Finally, Steve said, because the farm is not fenced and adjoins a busy car wash, "some amount of produce feeds the neighbors. But we're fine with that."

Following his talk, Steve expressed the hope that a younger generation of gardeners will help keep the farm going. In addition to volunteers, he said, the farm property needs "serious trimming" of intrusive woody plants.

PLANT SALE UPDATE

On Friday, February 14 and Tuesday, February 18, Debbie Daniels and Bob McMahon met at Washington Park Community School's greenhouse complex and sowed seed into a total of 48 flats of mainly herbs and native plants. Species included a variety of basil cultivars, thyme, rose mallow, ironweed, coleus, dill, parsley, and milkweed, to name a few for the May Plant Sale! Bob also took cuttings from his Thanksgiving and Christmas cacti at his home, treated them with rooting hormone, and stuck these directly into "3" pots for the Holiday Plant Sale in December. Additional crops to be grown from seed include vegetables, such as tomatoes and peppers, and some floriculture crops. Additional crops of flowers and vegetables started from purchased seedlings (AKA plugs) also will be ready for the May Plant Sale. If you are interested in helping with sowing seed and/or transplanting seedlings into containers, please contact Debbie Daniels. Thank you!

We are grateful to Julie Stanton, Coordinator and educator of the Greenhouse Program at the school, for giving us greenhouse space to grow these crops and will save the club a lot of money versus purchasing in finished plants.
