A Passion for (Tropical) Begonias by Carol Poh

As I watched Darren Palmer, our February speaker, carry in a boxful of specimens from his car, I knew we were in for an eye-opening talk. His subject was Begonias, but none of the plants he brought bore any resemblance to the begonias I knew. Indeed, the title of his opening slide, "Hi, My Name Is Begonia," slyly hinted at a vast plant family found across the globe.

The genus name Begonia (*Begoniaceae*) was coined by Charles Plumier, a French patron of botany, and adopted by the Swedish biologist Carl Linnaeus in 1753 to honor Michel Bégon, a former governor of the French colony of Saint-Domingue (now Haiti). It consists of some 2,040 species found in the subtropics and tropics ranging from Central and South America to sub-Saharan Africa and Southeast Asia.

Darren, a Cleveland software engineer who is also president of the Central Ohio Begonia Society, reeled off the many types of begonias. They can be cane-like, such as *B. maculata*, native to Brazil; trailing-scandent; rhizomatous, native to Oaxaca (Mexico), as well as to China and India; the showy *B. rex*, found in Bhutan and Myanmar; shrub-like, such as *B. foliosa*, found in Venezuela, Columbia, and Peru; thick-stemmed, found in southern Mexico and Honduras; and tuberous, native to tropical South America and sub-Saharan Africa. Then there is the hybrid *Begonia Semperflorens*, our familiar garden annuals.

Darren nurtures the many specimens he has collected in his basement, a space that he has adapted to provide the light, warmth, and humidity these tropical plants require. He favors plastic pots to conserve moisture and uses a variety of soil amendments, including vermiculite, perlite, earthworm castings, charcoal, and (for Asian species) limestone.

This writer was burning to know what led our speaker to his unusual passion. It began, he said, with an interest in carnivorous plants (owing to his aversion to swatting flies). He acquired a Venus flytrap (*Dionaea muscipula*). Then, one day he spotted a *B. maculata* (the "polka dot" begonia native to southeast Brazil) at Gales Garden Center in Westlake. "From there," he confessed, "it spiraled out of control."

More information about begonias can be found on the website of the American Begonia Society (established in 1932). Darren recommends *Begonias: Cultivation, Identification, and Natural History* (2005) by Mark C. Tebbitt as the "bible" on this diverse plant family.
