### What is Phenology? By Bob McMahon


According to Merriam-Webster Dictionary, phenology is a branch of science dealing with the relations between climate and periodic biological phenomena (such as bird migration or plant flowering). My parents taught me about phenology at an early age and I have been a phenology observer ever since. My Spring observations include when herbaceous perennial and woody plant species break dormancy and then flower/leaf out, lawns greening up and the first mowing of the season, annual gardens being planted, and migratory bird arrivals.

We now are in the month of March and the beginning of Spring! What have I observed so far? Right on schedule, daffodils started emerging last month and are now 1" to 2" high, depending on their proximity to relatively warm buildings. These shoots are tough and usually are not harmed by the cold weather. Two common examples of the first herbaceous Spring-flowering perennials are Snowdrops and snow crocus, both of which are showing buds, and will be flowering soon. Add to this the Lenten Rose or Helleborus, which typically flowers this month as do Skunk Cabbages. I have observed Hyacinths just starting to emerge as well. Buds are starting to swell on numerous tree species and maple syrup production is in full swing with the sap "running" in maple trees.

Migratory birds start to arrive in late February and this ramps up significantly this Month. Red-winged blackbirds started arriving in February and I also have observed American coots on Lake Erie. As you know, a significant number of robins overwinter here, but migratory robins will be arriving soon, increasing the numbers robins you see in your yards and gardens and that you start hearing their melodious songs again, especially in the mornings and evenings, a welcome sign of Spring! Many raptor species start nesting in February and March, including bald eagles and great horned owls.

I could go on and on here, but I just wanted to give you an idea about phenology and how much fun—and uplifting—it can be as you observe Nature starting to wake up in your yards and gardens this month after a long and cold winter. Enjoy!

### Bob McMahon's Family Recipe

#### BECKE'S SOUR CREAM CINNAMON COFFEE CAKE

3 large eggs

1.5 sticks of butter

1 cup of sugar

2 eggs

1 teaspoon vanilla

2 cups flour

2 teaspoons of baking powder

1 teaspoon of baking soda

1/8 teaspoon of salt

1 cup of sour cream



#### Crumb Filling/Topping Preparation:

1 cup of brown sugar

1 tablespoon of cinnamon

Blend these two ingredients thoroughly in a separate bowl

#### Coffee Cake Preparation:

Cream the butter and sugar. Add eggs and vanilla, blend well. Add the dry ingredients and sour cream and blend well.

- Spread half the batter uniformly in an 8" X 8" pan (spray with Pam beforehand to prevent sticking)
- Sprinkle HALF the crumb filling uniformly over the batter
- Add the remainder of the batter over the crumb filling and spread the batter uniformly over the filling
- Sprinkle the remainder of the crumb topping uniformly over the batter

Bake in a 350° oven for 35 to 50 minutes, depending on the oven—start checking the coffee cake for doneness at 35 minutes. When a knife is inserted into the coffee cake and it comes out clean, then the coffee cake is done. Remove, cool and enjoy!
